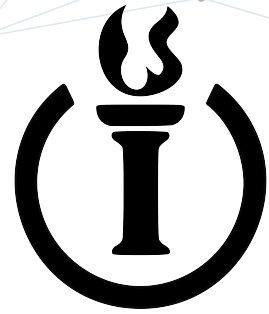


# International Computer Science Competition

## Ambassador Activities



Below is a list of suggested activities for ICSC Ambassadors. These ideas can support your outreach efforts. Be sure to document and submit your actions through your Ambassador account. You're also welcome to explore additional initiatives beyond this list.

### **1 Promote ICSC on Social Media**

Help spread awareness by sharing official ICSC posts and information across platforms such as Facebook and Instagram. Tag the official pages to help increase visibility.

### **2 Add Your ICSC Ambassador Role to Profiles**

Display your ICSC role proudly on your social and professional platforms like LinkedIn or Facebook. You can include a link to your ambassador profile.

### **3 Share ICSC with Friends and Classmates**

Talk to peers in your school, university, or community about ICSC, explaining what the competition is and why it's exciting. Encourage them to participate.

### **4 Talk to Teachers and Coordinators**

Introduce ICSC to teachers, club mentors, and school officials. Provide information about the educator platform and special awards for schools.

### **5 Present ICSC in Classes or Clubs**

Give a brief presentation about the competition during a class session or club meeting to spark interest among students.

### **6 Distribute Posters and Flyers**

Print and hang official ICSC posters at school, community centers, or libraries to attract attention. Digital copies can be found on the ICSC website.

### **7 Start a CS Club or Group**

Form a group at your school to explore CS problems together, host problem-solving sessions, or use ICSC problems to build engagement.

### **8 Organize CS Workshops or Events**

Plan events like coding workshops, project showcases, or Q&A sessions where you introduce ICSC and CS topics in an interactive way.



**9 Create a Local Social Media Group**

Establish a local WhatsApp or Facebook group for your school or city to coordinate ICSC efforts and share updates.

**10 Collaborate with Local Organizations**

Work with local tech hubs, clubs, or institutions to promote ICSC or co-host events that highlight the importance of computer science.

**11 Share ICSC through Newsletters or Blogs**

Submit a short article about ICSC to your school's newsletter, student blog, or internal communication platforms.

**12 Encourage Other Schools to Join**

Extend outreach to other schools or universities in your area. Offer to share materials or connect them with the ICSC organizing team.

**13 Arrange Local Meetups**

Organize informal meetups for interested students to discuss CS topics and learn more about the competition together.

**14 Support the Qualification Round at Your School**

Coordinate with teachers to hold a scheduled Qualification Round session and assist participants in preparing and submitting their solutions.

**15 Represent ICSC at Local Events**

If your school or city hosts academic fairs, tech fests, or STEM days, represent ICSC by setting up a booth or delivering a short talk.

**16 Inspire Through Your Own Participation**

Lead by example—participate actively in ICSC and share your journey and insights with others to motivate them.
